Te Rapa Primary School's teaching and support staff pride ourselves in providing a quality education for all students at all levels. # ***Out and About Te Rapa Primary School***

## ***Term 3, 2020***



### **Whole School**

- Te Rapa HEART:** Teachers are continuing to discuss and teach the Te Rapa HEART values as we get back into school life. They are re teaching the expectations as we look to embed these values in our children so they are lifelong values they take with them. Teachers are discussing with children the importance of not just talking the talk but actually walking the walk!

### **Year 1 & 2 Syndicate**

Room 2 begins the term with 8 new students and Room 3 will begin in week 6. During Term 3 the Junior Team will be focusing their learning around dinosaurs and fossils. This focus will integrate key learning areas of the curriculum such as literacy, maths, science and art. During week 6 they will visit the Waikato Museum and get to see some life size models of dinosaurs and have the opportunity to ask questions, to extend and consolidate their learning. During the visit the students will also get the chance to visit Excite where they have the opportunity to explore hands-on activities that include simple machines, bridge building and sustainability. Room 6 will be exploring the human body, healthy eating and getting the chance to use the new anatomical human body resource.

**Literacy:** Guided reading and writing continues this term as well as shared reading and writing.

**Maths:** The Junior Syndicate continues to use Pr1me and 'Becoming Pr1me Ready' as their main resource.

**ICT:** The Junior Syndicate continues to work on developing their Digital Fluency Skills as well as Seesaw. Abbie Gibson continues to support the team with their use of Google Docs.

**P.E:** Cross Country training will be the focus for PE sessions for the first half of this term. The Syndicate will join together to run some fitness rotations to support training as well as practise running the course. Following the Cross country event in week 5, the team will then move to developing large ball skills for the remainder of the term.

### **Year 3 & 4 Syndicate**

**Literacy:** Weeks 1-5 the focus will be on poetry for reading, writing and oral language. The children will all be selecting a poem to recite to their class in Week 4 and then there will be Syndicate finals in Week 5. Year groups and boys and girls compete separately. When writing poetry the children will be learning to add interest to writing by using language features such as a simile, alliteration, onomatopoeia as well as developing their knowledge of verbs, nouns, adjectives and adverbs.

**Mathematics:** They will continue to use PR1ME as the main resource for their programmes.

This Friday there will be a Mathletics assembly celebrating silver and gold certificates earned as well as top Mathletes in each class and the overall winning class from Term 2. This is always held in the first week of the next term to give the students until the Sunday after the term finishes to complete the Mathletics week!

**ICT:** The team will continue to use Seesaw as a platform for sharing their learning as well as creativity.

**Inquiry:** The Syndicate will have three 'The Arts' Inquiry days in Week 6 exploring the following through Drama, Visual Art and Music.

Context: Let me share a story...

Big Idea: The Arts are alternative ways to be creative (as opposed to written texts)

Deeper Understandings:

- The Arts communicate a message
- There are different techniques through The Arts to share a story

Underlying Concept: People can express a message through creativity

**P.E:** Weeks 1 and 2 the team will complete their Winter Sports rotation from Term 2 as sessions were postponed due to the wet weather. Training for our annual Cross Country will then be the focus until the end of Week 5. In Week 6-10 each class will be preparing a Jump Jam dance for the Syndicate finals in Week 10.

## Year 5 & 6 Syndicate

The Team welcomes Mrs Ritete back to Room 15 - she is looking forward to getting to know her students and working with them for the remainder of the year.

**Literacy:** Their writing this term will be Speeches and Persuasive Writing, consolidating basic writing skills to improve writing. In Reading the team will focus on Guided Silent Reading, Inference and questioning about the text.

**Word Work and Spelling:** Word work will once again be a focus for the team, throughout Stage 3 students beginning to look at long vowel patterns and digraphs and the rules that come with these to help their spelling. Essential Spelling Lists are also a focus, encouraging children to master words that are often spelt wrong from these lists (up to List 6).

**Maths:** Year 5 & 6 students continue to develop Mathematical concepts and understanding with a focus on Problem Solving and Knowledge Development through the PRIME Mathematics Programme.

**Inquiry:** This term their team will be taking a closer look at The General Election. Some focus areas will be:

**P.E.:** Week 1-5 their team will be training for the annual Cross Country. Following this they will continue their Sports Rotation from Term 2 with Jump Jam included for fitness when the weather is poor.

**Health:** This term they will be looking at Sexuality Education. Their students will be separated into Year 5 and Year 6 and teachers will work through the Discovering Me - The Sexuality Road resource.

**Rotation:** The team will continue their Rotation which includes Music, the new Digital Technologies Curriculum - looking at different ways to code, Dance and Drama combined, Science and Technology. Each class has three sessions with the teacher teaching these topics. They are up to the 3rd rotation for this to start Term 3.

## Year 7 & 8 Syndicate

Term 3 is shaping up to be an extremely busy term for the Year 7 & 8 Syndicate. There are a number of WFPS events, winter sports competitions, cross country, ICAS exams, Wai Maths, leadership courses and camp preparation. They will also run a **Sports Competition Week** to replace Sports Camp this year.

### Camp Update

They received a huge number of parent interest forms. The student health form and permission to attend will be due back at the end of Week 2 - confirming numbers will enable us to decide whether the camp will be a viable financial option this year.

### Teaching and Learning Classroom Focus:

**Mathematics:** Streamed 'Connecting the Strand' classes continue to focus on Measurement and Geometry. 'Pr1me Maths' continues to focus on Fractions/Decimals and Measurement/Statistics.

They also have two teams training for the Waikato Waimath competition coming up on August the 12th during Maths Week.

**Writing:** Speeches will be a focus for the first few weeks preparing for their Syndicate Speech competition in Week 4 with the syndicate final being held in Week 5. Classes will also continue to work on specific writing and recrafting skills. They will finish the term writing short stories. They will continue to develop knowledge of spelling patterns, word origins, sentence structures and new vocabulary.

**Reading - Guided Reading: Poetry:** Visualising images, clarifying words and phrases and presenting will be a focus for the beginning of the term. They will then look at short stories and use these as a model and motivation for their own writing.

**Inquiry:** They will have an art focus: **CAN ART PERSUADE? is our overarching idea.** Students will investigate; How art can affect opinions and ideas and How art can do this?

**Physical Education and Health:** For health they will begin, **'The Sexuality Road'**, this will run throughout the term. As a team they have made some modification to the programme based on the needs of the students in the syndicate. Their PE focus for Term 3 will be **Fitness** and **GAMES** - Encouraging teamwork and leadership with a focus on Cross Country in Week 5.

**ICT:** A range of activities to develop skills using Google Docs, Slides, Sheets and Forms within their classroom programmes. All classes are using technology as a tool to assist their learning on a daily basis. They will also continue to use their eportfolios to share their learning.

**Saturday music classes** - Enrolments are open for Term Three 2020 at the Waikato Community School of Music (formerly Hamilton Community Centre of Music). The first session is on **Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> August**. The school caters for all ages (3 to retired) and ability levels. We offer both group-format and one-to-one tuition. Group-format term fees range from \$39 to \$105 (8 lessons in Term 3) depending on age and instrument. The enrolment fee for any instrument class includes unlimited participation in our ensembles. One-to-one classes assist students to prepare for exams and earn NCEA credits. A music appreciation/readiness programme (*Music Makers*) is available from age 3. *Young Voices* children's choir caters for those ages 9+.
