Please inform **anyone you know** (neighbours, work mates, colleagues, friends etc) that Te Rapa needs to hear from them if they are considering Te Rapa as a possible future enrolment option for their pre-school child (1, 2, 3 or 4 year olds).

Our current "immediate" focus however is children who are turning 5 years old between 16th December 2020 and 9th July 2021. Applications for a place at Te Rapa for next year should be made no later than 3.15pm Tuesday 17th November 2020.

Out of Zone Ballot re. Enrolment Scheme**Places for Terms 1 & 2 2021 Intake #1**

The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents interested in enrolling their child(ren) at Te Rapa Primary School for Terms 1 & 2 next year. Te Rapa has an enrolment scheme and a home zone to prevent overcrowding. This appears on the school's website. Please make contact with the school for all in-zone pre-enrolments for 2021.

For the Term 1 & 2 intake the Board of Trustees has determined there is likely to be 18 x out-of-zone places at the new entrant (5 year olds) level. This is for children starting school for the first time and who will be turning 5 years old between 16th December 2020 and 9th July 2021. There may be places at other levels. The actual number of out of zone places will be determined by the number of in-zone enrolments we receive.

Office staff are available on (07) 8492232 or admin@terapa.school.co.nz for distribution of information, enrolment packs and application forms. Applications for a 2021 "out of zone" place for either Term 1 or 2 must be received by 3.15pm Tuesday 17th November 2020. All applicants will then be contacted in writing regarding the outcome of the ballot.

Teachers consider a child's effort and achievement(s) over the entire year, but more specifically the second half of the year. A student's effort and behaviour over these final weeks in the classroom and the playground will be seriously considered too. It is important that the adults in a child's life are constantly guiding / coaching them on how they can help themselves through any evaluation / assessment process.

Police Visit Acceptable Internet Use and Being a Good "On-line" Citizen

Our 10 x senior classes (Years 5 – 8) recently hosted Police Officers who were here to talk with our older students about ...

- (1) acceptable use of the internet, and
- (2) how to be good citizens when on-line.

Too many children are able to access the internet without adult supervision, and this sees children viewing sites that they should not have access to. Many have their own cellphones or devices too and are using these to communicate and potentially bully others online. The Police focus was to educate students on acceptable use guidelines, how to be a "good person" when communicating with others on-line and to reinforce that social media eg. *facebook* is for children over the age of 13 years. Teachers have been teaching these guidelines to our students for many years, and we would encourage all Te Rapa parents / carers to **make it your business to know your child's business**.

Police Officers confirmed that parents / carers should not wait. Now is the time for parents / carers to start keeping a close eye on these things, and especially anything to do with the internet and their children interacting with others on-line.

Future Leaders at Te Rapa Primary School

As Principal I expect all student leaders and our seniors to lead from the front. They are to set an example for others. I make no apologies for placing high expectations on Te Rapa students across our school and in particular those "future leaders" who are ready for leadership. We should expect big things from our younger students too. They must *"buy into"* the role of responsibility if they choose to accept a role in leadership. It is not appropriate for Te Rapa's aspiring leaders to act or behave in an inappropriate way either in school or in the wider community. They must be on their best behaviour consistently, and make us (school & family) proud of them. Future leaders have the rest of Term 4 to start showing us that they are ready to step up for 2021. School staff are currently looking to see which students are ready / worthy.

Student Leadership : A Student's Voice What does "student leadership" at Te Rapa Primary School look like to me ?

Courts (Astro Turf) & Cricket Nets RENTED "Keys" for 2020 / 2021

Security CCTV Cameras Now Operating

We have changed all the locks and the keying system on our school astro-turf courts gate and our 2 x cricket net gates. This means that all issued Tennis Court and Cricket Net keys from last year will not work for this summer. If you are a parent coach / manager of one of our school teams that use the courts (netball, hockey, tennis) or our cricket nets can you please return your key to the school ASAP. If you are a school family or member of the community who has rented a key, then please return this immediately to receive your \$\$\$ refund.

SCHOOL FUNDRAISER New "Keying" System

All locks to our courts and cricket nets have been changed. Please see office staff if you are interested in renting a Tennis Court or a Cricket Net key for the upcoming summer. You will need to read, and sign a contract first.

If you want access to both facilities, you will need to rent and pay for both keys and sign 2 x contracts. They are separate facilities.

The rent for a key is set at **\$70.00** per key for the public over the summer for tennis and the equivalent for a cricket key, and **\$60.00** per key to a school family. There is to be **NO sharing of keys**. A \$15 refund happens when keys are returned in May 2021 so the actual rental fee is \$55 for the public and \$45 per school family. The key will unlock the gate padlock, and the contract explains the guidelines around usage. This is a **school fundraiser**, so please promote this to friends and relatives in the wider community too.

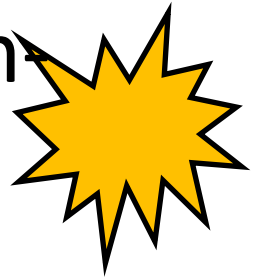

Thank all those who assisted by umpiring and managing teams for our coaches and children. Your assistance with these roles is greatly appreciated and does not go unnoticed.

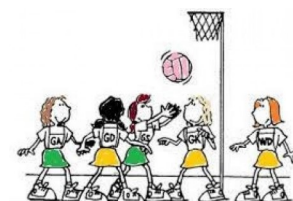

JOIN THE TE RAPA PRIMARY SCHOOL GROUP FOR THE WEETBIX TRYATHLON 2021!

Te Rapa School will again be entering a school group into next year's Weetbix Tryathlon. Entry is open to all 6-15 year old's (based on your age on event day).

This is an iconic kiwi sporting event that gives kids a realistic goal to train for and the satisfaction of completing the course, receiving a medal and not to mention their Weetbix T-Shirts. We have seen the benefit and the confidence students have gained from taking part. **It is also a great training opportunity for the year 5/6 school and inter-school triathlon!**

Children can enter as individual contestants or in junior or senior teams (it is up to students to find their own team members).

There is no timing for the event and it really is all about "GIVING IT A TRY".

The distances of each leg per age group are as follows (based on age on event day):

All students who enter as part of our school group will be eligible for the special "School Group Entry Price" of \$45.00 pp. Early bird registrations close on 31 January 2021.

While Te Rapa School enters as a group, we ask that all parents register their children and pay Weetbix Tryathlon directly as this eliminates the need for the school to get involved in the financial side of things. Parents will need to provide transport and accompany their children to the event.

- The next box will ask you: "Your school may have created a School Group. Would you like to join your SCHOOL GROUP?" select "YES – JOIN MY SCHOOL GROUP". Then continue. Please ensure you complete this section, otherwise your child will not be linked to our school!
- In the next section "School Group Name" please type Te Rapa Primary into the search box. The search results will show Te Rapa Primary School, please select "JOIN". A confirmation box of the school you are joining will appear, please select "JOIN" again.
- On the personal info page, add your own details to the Parent/Guardian section and your child's details to their section.
- Continue answering the medical questions, emergency contact details and other questions.
- Agree to the safety rules and click continues.
- If you have finished registering your child click continue and complete the payment details

Once registered I will be able to see your registration on my School Group List. It is really helpful if you also send me an email confirming you have entered your child rachel@stakeout.co.nz.

Club Energize will be hosting a tryathlon training programme at the Waikato University and at Te Rapa Primary School. This is very helpful, especially for children who have not completed a tryathlon before.
