Learning Support Ends for 2020

.... New Facilities for 2021

Many Te Rapa students have been fortunate to have received extra specialist assistance this year in literacy : reading & writing, and maths. This is in addition to their classroom programmes. We have also offered extra extension programmes (GATE) in a number of other curriculum areas too. Te Rapa is proud of the extra specialist teaching we provide for students, and each year we try to use resources to maximise the learning programmes for those students who need it most. Learning Support programmes and GATE (Gifted & Talented Ed.) have ended for 2020, but we are already looking to shape up programmes for 2021 with new "breakout learning spaces" being built beside Rooms 17 and 18, and also Rooms 10 and 11. Please appreciate that 'learning support' and 'extra teaching' programmes are unique, and our priority is to target those students where there are "gaps to fill" in their learning. We also extend and stimulate our most advanced students too.

The 3 x Pronged Approach

School – Student - Home

We are just #1 approach, and the student themselves and you as their parents / cares are critical as #2 and #3. The school cannot do it alone. We need to get the student themselves switched on to learning, along with an effective home-school partnership working well. If all 3 x are moving forward together we are able to make progress, and if we can do it exceptionally well then progress accelerates more rapidly. Please remember an individual student's attitude / engagement determines their level of learning. Providing they focus and give their best to "soak up" what learning is offered / taught at school, and this is actively supported and endorsed at home, then students progress as expected.

Reporting to Parents on Student Achievement 2020

End of Year Reports

End of Year Reports are published at 3pm Thursday 17th Dec. and are sent home via students that afternoon. Reports will be posted out to a student's known address c/o the "primary caregiver" if the student is not attending school on that day.

Class Placements for 2021

Every teacher is involved in the placement of their students for next year. Decisions are made about each student and we carefully consider who would work best with which teacher, and which of their peers a student should not be placed with. Senior leadership personnel are also actively involved linking a student's learning style(s) with a teacher's strengths and teaching style(s). A student's learning needs are very important and especially so for key students who might need on-going learning support / guidance or extension. A child's wider interests are also considered when looking at particular teachers. We also carefully consider 'group' dynamics and how groups of students might mould together over 4 x school Terms. As experienced educators we use our professional judgement to place students where we strongly believe they will achieve their best, and will work to their potential.

Students are not placed according to parent requests, or to satisfy a child's social preference (with friends).

In many cases we endeavour to reduce potential social distractions so "learning & teaching" times are utilised to best effect. I can assure parents and carers that we take the role of placing students very seriously when setting them up for success for their new school year.

Enrolments 2021

We continue to receive a huge amount of interest from parents / carers wanting to enrol their children at our school and we do try our best to accommodate whenever we can. Inter-school Senior Athletic Fixtures Year 7 & 8 Senior Team

As reported in the previous newsletter our Senior Athletics Team were not able to compete this year at Porritt Stadium due to the weather. Congratulations on being selected for this team in 2020 even though you were not able to compete. We are proud of you.

Year 4, 5 & 6 Team

It was really pleasing that the weather was kind to our Yr 4 – 6 Inter-school Athletic Team this year. Drivers – Please park in a helpful way when we have buses arriving / departing

Please be understanding when arriving at school in the afternoon (and morning) and the cones are out ready for the buses. Our priority is to get all children off the buses safely. To do this buses must have priority parking. Cones are there to close off certain sections of the driveway so buses can pull in and park. We can then off load the children. It is unhelpful when a driver feels their car should have priority, and they choose to park in the driveway ignoring the coned areas or in a way where you are blocking the driveway or similar.

Know about School Trips and Off-Site Events

Please keep an eye on the school newsletter, Term Plan, school APP, website and also our "Upcoming Events" sign at the front of the school. These publish the dates of school events, and provide drivers with a guide to when buses will be arriving / departing for off-site trips / events. Each driver is asked to make changes to your arrival time on these afternoons and to plan where to park. Please also alert your children so they know what is planned for that afternoon pick-up too. To arrive at your usual time, and to also expect to park in your usual spot will simply not work so all drivers must be "well informed" and must adapt on these afternoons when we are hosting buses in the school driveway.

Summer Time at Te Rapa Primary School Pool

As the weather is starting to heat up this is our opportunity to inform you of our opening hours over the summer.

Beginning Saturday December 5th, Te Rapa Primary School Aquatic Centre will be open on the weekends to the public. Our hours on Saturdays are 12- 6pm and 2-6pm on Sundays. From Saturday December 21st we will be open daily until school is back in. Our hours will be 12-6pm Monday through Saturday and, once again, 2 – 6 pm on Sundays. Once school restarts we will then continue to open in the weekends for as long as the weather allows us.

As the pool is available for public bookings please check our facebook page which is **Te Rapa Primary School Pool** as there will be weekly updates as to variations to our normal opening hours. We would hate for you to turn up expecting to swim and it is booked out.

We are proud to be able to keep our admission prices the same as they have been for the last eight years. They are as follows:

Toddlers 0-2 years of age are free

Children 3 – 13 years of age \$2.00

Adults 13 years of age and over are \$3.00

Spectators are free

Our qualified lifeguards are Sandra, Laura, Noah and Tapua.

All children 3 years and under must wear an approved swimming nappy regardless of whether they are toilet trained or not. We ask that all children under the age of 10 are supervised by a caregiver 16 years of age or above. In addition all children 5 years of age or under must be kept within arm's reach of an adult caregiver at all times.

We will be closed to the public for Christmas and New Year's from Thursday December 24th – Monday December 28th and Thursday December 31st – Monday January 4th 2021.

This is an iconic kiwi sporting event that gives kids a realistic goal to train for and the satisfaction of completing the course, receiving a medal and not to mention their Weetbix T-Shirts. We have seen the benefit and the confidence students have gained from taking part. **It is also a great training opportunity for the year 5/6 school and inter-school triathlon!**

Children can enter as individual contestants or in junior or senior teams (it is up to students to find their own team members).

There is no timing for the event and it really is all about "GIVING IT A TRY".

All students who enter as part of our school group will be eligible for the special "School Group Entry Price" of \$45.00 pp. Early bird registrations close on 31 January 2021.

While Te Rapa School enters as a group, we ask that all parents register their children and pay Weetbix Tryathlon directly as this eliminates the need for the school to get involved in the financial side of things. Parents will need to provide transport and accompany their children to the event.

- In the next section "School Group Name" please type Te Rapa Primary into the search box. The search results will show Te Rapa Primary School, please select "JOIN". A confirmation box of the school you are joining will appear, please select "JOIN" again.
- On the personal info page, add your own details to the Parent/Guardian section and your child's details to their section.
- Continue answering the medical questions, emergency contact details and other questions.
- Agree to the safety rules and click continues.
- If you have finished registering your child click continue and complete the payment details
