End of Year Reports 2020 Reporting to Parents on Student Achievement

Final end of year reports were published at 3pm today (Thurs. 17th Dec) and sent home to parents via students. Teachers have assessed students in-depth during the second half of 2020 and have used this as the basis, along with teacher observation, to compile their final report.

Class Placements for 2021

Teachers were involved in the placement of their students for next year. Decisions are made after careful consideration about each student. Which child might work best with which available teacher, and which of their peers a student should not be placed with are important. Senior leadership personnel are also actively involved in linking a student's learning style(s) with a teacher's strengths and teaching style(s). A student's learning needs are a priority and especially for students who might need on-going learning support / guidance or extension. A child's wider interests are considered when looking at particular teachers. Group dynamics, and how groups of students might mould as a class over 4 x Terms is also important. As experienced educators we consider all of these things and use our **professional judgement** to place students where we know they will achieve their best. **Students are not placed according to parent requests, or to satisfy social preferences.**

Being Really "Up Beat" about Your Child's 2021 School Year

Please encourage your child(ren) to **feel "good"** about their 2021 school year and start doing this **now**.

Supportive and encouraging comments / messages from parents to your child(ren) about their school, their placement in a new classroom with their new teacher(s) and the pending programme helps them to form positive feelings about school. This positive-ness helps a child make the most of the opportunities that are presented to them. Having an **"up-beat" outlook** and something **"exciting and new"** to look forward to and work towards will certainly influence their attitude and approach to their schooling next year. This can only help them achieve their best.

Of course **the reverse also applies**, so please **don't** share negative opinions with your children, or make comments in "ear shot" of them. This only hinders their ability to grasp the many good things on offer, and progress is stifled. Ultimately they may not reach their potential if they are hearing this type of comment.

Parent messages / support are extremely important

As shared above, your child's attitude to school and their 2021 teacher / classroom (and of course to many other things too) will mirror the attitudes promoted by you (their parent). You determine the **"frame of mind"** your son / daughter will have to school in 2021. You can also manage how well they respond to their teacher(s), their peers and how they build and maintain relationships with others too during the year. Please adopt an approach that will help them to grow and develop positively, and encourage them to "learn" the skills to adapt to each new year, each new class and each new teacher. These are life skills that every student must learn, and these 'learning experiences' are what helps to shape them to become a successful "team member" in both their personal lives and in their future careers. Learning **effective people skills** for every situation is paramount, and the messages we as **parent coaches** send our children are extremely important too.

Our school is a **NO SMOKING** zone, and is a **NO SKATEBOARDING** school.

Summer Time at Te Rapa Primary School Pool

As the weather is starting to heat up this is our opportunity to inform you of our opening hours over the summer.

Beginning Saturday December 5th, Te Rapa Primary School Aquatic Centre will be open on the weekends to the public. Our hours on Saturdays are 12- 6pm and 2-6pm on Sundays. From Saturday December 21st we will be open daily until school is back in. Our hours will be 12-6pm Monday through Saturday and, once again, 2 – 6 pm on Sundays. Once school restarts we will then continue to open in the weekends for as long as the weather allows us.

As the pool is available for public bookings please check our facebook page which is **Te Rapa Primary School Pool** as there will be weekly updates as to variations to our normal opening hours. We would hate for you to turn up expecting to swim and it is booked out.

We are proud to be able to keep our admission prices the same as they have been for the last eight years. They are as follows:

Toddlers 0-2 years of age are free

Children 3 – 13 years of age \$2.00

Adults 13 years of age and over are \$3.00

Spectators are free

Our qualified lifeguards are Sandra, Laura, Noah and Tapua.

All children 3 years and under must wear an approved swimming nappy regardless of whether they are toilet trained or not. We ask that all children under the age of 10 are supervised by a caregiver 16 years of age or above. In addition all children 5 years of age or under must be kept within arm's reach of an adult caregiver at all times.

We will be closed to the public for Christmas and New Year's from Thursday December 24th – Monday December 28th and Thursday December 31st – Monday January 4th 2021.

JOIN THE TE RAPA PRIMARY SCHOOL GROUP FOR THE WEETBIX TRYATHLON 2021!

Te Rapa School will again be entering a school group into next year's Weetbix Tryathlon. Entry is open to all 6-15 year olds (based on your age on event day).

This is an iconic kiwi sporting event that gives kids a realistic goal to train for and the satisfaction of completing the course, receiving a medal and not to mention their Weetbix T-Shirts. We have seen the benefit and the confidence students have gained from taking part. **It is also a great training opportunity for the year 5/6 school and inter-school triathlon!**

Children can enter as individual contestants or in junior or senior teams (it is up to students to find their own team members).

There is no timing for the event and it really is all about "GIVING IT A TRY".

The distances of each leg per age group are as follows (based on age on event day):

All students who enter as part of our school group will be eligible for the special "School Group Entry Price" of \$45.00 pp. Early bird registrations close on 31 January 2021.

While Te Rapa School enters as a group, we ask that all parents register their children and pay Weetbix Tryathlon directly as this eliminates the need for the school to get involved in the financial side of things. Parents will need to provide transport and accompany their children to the event.

- In the next section "School Group Name" please type Te Rapa Primary into the search box. The search results will show Te Rapa Primary School, please select "JOIN". A confirmation box of the school you are joining will appear, please select "JOIN" again.
- On the personal info page, add your own details to the Parent/Guardian section and your child's details to their section.
- Continue answering the medical questions, emergency contact details and other questions.
- Agree to the safety rules and click continues.
- If you have finished registering your child click continue and complete the payment details

Once registered I will be able to see your registration on my School Group List. It is really helpful if you also send me an email confirming you have entered your child rachel@stakeout.co.nz.

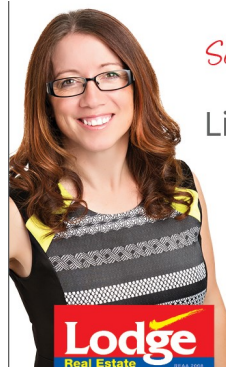
